THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

“Pilgrim’s Playlist.” That is a truly appropriate title for this series of sermons. We are all pilgrims, sojourners, aliens, and strangers on our way to our true homeland. There is movement in these songs. If you think back to Psalm 120, you will remember that its setting is distant lands... Meshech and Kedar, places where God’s dispersed people were forced to dwell. And it describes the distress those exiles felt as they lived far from the peace, the shalom, of the presence of God. Psalms 121, 122, and 123 describe looking...looking to God’s place, to his house and to him! The next few Psalms reflect trust in God as the One who is for his people; One who keeps them, restores them, builds them; One who fills their mouths with laughter (Psalm 126:2). Then we come to Psalm 128. It is as though we have reached the end of the journey. We are home. All is as it should be. That is what this Psalm gives to us; a picture of life as it was meant to be. There is great encouragement for us in this, for while the Psalms are not naive about life in the midst of the world (notice what follows Psalm 128!), life can be better when we ‘walk in his ways’ (Psalm 128:1). May God grant the grace we need to walk as he would have us that our lives might be characterized by the exuberance we find in our call to worship!




