THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

In the Joseph story, there are no more familiar scenes than what we find in Genesis 39-40. While we could have divided the chapters, I trust that you will see how the larger theme of the section unfolds: as things go from bad to worse — from slavery through a rape allegation to jail — God was still with Joseph. He never abandons him, never lets him go.

That's a message that we always need to hear because we desperately need hope to make it through every single day: hope that God is with us, hope that he is guiding and directing our lives, hope that justice and righteousness will prevail in the end, hope that the world will be made new when Jesus returns again.

We learn to hope when we meditate on God's Word, when we find in Jesus Christ all that we need, when we commit ourselves to Word, sacrament, and prayer. These means of grace that we use today are meant to lead us to Jesus, God with us, God for us, God in us. He is the only one who gives us sustaining, persevering, gracious hope. Let us draw near to him, knowing that he has already drawn near to us!
