THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

On this day in which we remember the Protestant Reformation, you will notice that several elements of our service have close connection to that time in which the Gospel was recovered. Our call to worship and opening hymn are drawn from Psalm 46 — Luther's "A Mighty Fortress" is actually a meditation upon that psalm. Likewise, our confession of sin is drawn from the Lutheran Service Book, which has its roots in confessions of sin going back to Reformation days; the assurance of pardon is the text that led to Luther's "Reformational discovery." Our statement of faith is based particularly upon a key section from John Calvin's *A Little Book on the Christian Life* (which is itself a simpler version of a section from his *Institutes*, 3.6-10). And our service closes with a key affirmation of the Reformation — that all our hope is in Christ alone.

Our sermon will focus on the heart of the Reformation, the Gospel itself as explained from the most famous verse in the Bible. In this one verse, we have the entire Gospel contained; in this one verse, we have the reason for the Reformation itself — the recovery of the Gospel, which declares to us our danger and points us to Christ as our Savior, all rooted in God's deep and abiding love for us. May God bring about a new Reformation for our day, in which the Gospel of Jesus Christ is declared in all of its purity and power!

All: The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress! Amen! Let us




