THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

We come to this familiar scene at the wedding party in Cana this morning. There are so many questions that come from this passage: why did Mary tell Jesus that “they have no wine”? What does Jesus mean when he says, “My hour has not yet come”? Why does Mary respond to that mild rebuke with confidence that Jesus will act? What is the significance of the water pots for the Jewish ritual of purification? Why is it important that the best wine came last? How did this sign manifest Jesus’ glory? And what in the world does any of this have to do with us today?

What we will find is that this passage — like every passage in John’s Gospel — is meant to point us to Jesus, so that we might love him more, so that our relationship might be deepened, enriched, and sustained. And really, that’s the role of corporate worship: we come to sing praise to the Lord as our rock; we confess our sins to our God in the sure confidence that, with the Lord, is unfailing love and full redemption; we pray and lay our hurts and hopes before him; and we hear his promises restated to sustain our discipleship in this weary world. May God grant us grace to love him more today than we did yesterday and more tomorrow than we do today!

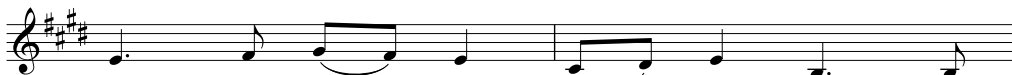


