THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

It's hard to deny how contentious our world has become over the past year. We seem to be a culture ready for battle at the slightest comment or difference of opinion. People circle the internet and social media like sharks with blood in the water, seeking only to pounce with harsh words or an angry spirit; and our temptation is to believe that culture is outside of us — but it's not. Churches all over our denomination, city, and world are being torn apart by a quarrelsome and combative spirit. And it's not just our churches, it's our marriages, workplaces, and families.

This morning we continue through our series on the Fruit of the Spirit, and we've reached kindness: a virtue that so many of us need and yet so few of us have. He is the purest expression of the Fruit of the Spirit, and because of that, he helps us understand and grow in kindness. What is kindness, and how can I be more kind? Great questions . . . we will consider those as we worship and praise our strong and kind God.

THE CORPORATE CONFESSION OF SIN

Do you suppose, O man — you who judge those who practice such things and yet do them yourself — that you will escape the judgment of God? THE STATEMENT OF FAITH

The New City Catechism, Q and A 18-20

The Minister: Will God allow our disobedience and idolatry to go unpunished?
