## THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

Today we conclude our series from Galatians 5:22-23, the fruit of the Spirit. As we will see, we are engaged in a war . . . a war within. Some of us take this war seriously. Others of us have become complacent with respect to it. Still others are in denial about it. As a result, some of us need very much to be reassured that the war will be won; others need to be reawakened or awakened to the danger and deadening effects of our complacency or denial. What can be said with certainty is that the only hope for any and all of us is the Spirit of the Father and Son comforting and convicting, transforming and enabling. The Spirit is mentioned seven times in our text. That should tell us something. True “self-control” will not be a fruit of the flesh—hard work, discipline, energy. Only the Spirit will be its Author. And so as we come to worship, the themes of this spiritual battle, and the hope and help of God the Father and God the Son, present to us in the person of God the Spirit, are woven together. May God grant us grace to answer as GK Chesterton when asked, “What is wrong with the world?” He responded, “I am.” And may God grant us a double measure of grace that we might, by the Spirit’s power, evidence the fruit of the Spirit in fullness . . . love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.

## THE STATEMENT OF FAITH

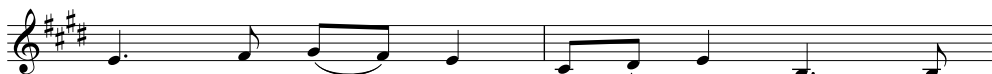
